GCSE PERFORMANCE JUNE 2022

All external public GCSE exams resumed after a two-year gap. This was the first cohort taking examinations post Covid. We would like to congratulate all the pupils for their efforts and perseverance throughout this difficult period, to overcome huge challenges and focus on their education was by no means a small task.

Alhamdulillah, our results were very much in line with previous cohort performances with high percentage of pupils achieving above a good grade 5 in many subjects.

Hadith of the week

Attaining the Level of Tranquillity in Prayers

Khushu in Salaah

Without calmness, tranquillity and khushu in salaah, salaah is void and not acceptable in the sight of Allah Almighty. Linguistically, Khushu connotes feeling of intense reverence, submission, and respect by imparting the sense of sheer fear, acknowledgement, and authority towards Rab ul Aalameen. Quran cited it as:

"Certainly will the believers have succeeded: They who are during their prayer humbly submissive." [Quran 23: 1-2]

Khushu has strengthened its roots deep into religion Islam, that the acceptance of Salah is entirely dependent on the level of tranquillity whilst offering prayers. Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) used to make following dua to seek Allah's blessings pertaining to Khushu in his Ibada'h as stated:

"O Allah, I seek refuge with you from the non-beneficial knowledge, from a heart that does not possess khushu from the evil desire which is never satisfied and from supplications which are not accepted." [Muslim]

Khushu in prayers or essence of tranquillity breeds Khauf (fear) that restrains a Muslim from pernicious satanic whispers to refrain him from falling in to sins of transgressors. Calmness deeply correlates with Salah though not confined to it yet in the remembrance of Allah hearts beseech tranquillity.

Practically attaining and implementing tranquillity in Salah is not a daunting task but an achievable custom, it immense one's soul in to the true spirit of prayers with sublime concentration.



The Prophets (PBUH) Mercy Towards The Elderly

A Duty of the Young

Anas ibn Malik (may Allah be pleased with him) narrated that the Prophet (peace and blessings be upon him) said, "If a young man honours an elderly on account of his age, Allah appoints someone to honour him in his old age." (At-Tirmidhi)

The Prophet (peace and blessings be upon him) here advises the young of the Muslim society, who will be tomorrow's elderly, to honour the elderly. Continuous application of this Prophetic advice helps bridge the gap between generations and spreads an atmosphere of love and understanding between the young and the old. Consider here also the generaliza-

tion in the Prophet's (peace and blessings be upon him) words: "If a young man honours an elderly;" the hadith requires honouring the elderly regardless of their colour or religion.

In another hadith Muslims are told to be merciful to all people, Muslim and non-Muslim:

Anas ibn Malik (may Allah be pleased with him) narrated that the Prophet (peace and blessings be upon him) said, "By Him in Whose Power my soul is, Allah does not bestow His mercy except on a merciful one." They (the Companions) said, "All of us are merciful." The Prophet (peace and blessings be upon him) replied, "Not only that each of you has mercy upon the other, but to have mercy also upon all people."






