


## Ahaadeeth of the week!





Below are the Ahaadeeth we have covered each week since the beginning of the term.










## Environmental ethics in Islam

## Islamic & Religious Studies

Class	Topics covered so far
7	The year 7 class have covered the basics of Islam, and have started some teachings about Christianity to expand their knowledge across RS. In IS they have gained knowledge on the life of Prophet Yusuf (AS), rulings on najasah, and how to take care of oneself through puberty.
8	In IS, the year 8 class have learnt about the importance of Zakat and Sadaqah, Rules for Masbuq and lahiq, and the importance of Surah Al-Imran.  In RS, students have studied some fundamental aspects of Judaism, this helped them explore the teachings to Jews, and the true meaning of Judaism.
9	The year 9 have studied about how to live life according to the Sunnah, some parts of the Umayyed Empire, and exploring the evidence of God's existence. InshAllah they can apply this new knowledge to their daily lives.  In RS, the year 9 have taken on the tough topic of religion and philosophy, from this they have gained knowledge on evidencing God's existence via the cosmos.  We are very confident to start their journey of RS GCSE from January which will give them a head start.
10	In RS, the year 10 class have observed Theme A topics such as marriage and divorce for paper 2 exam. There are two more topics left in this theme, then they will sit a mini test on this Theme.  In IS, we have explored on the importance of the Fiqh on money. We looked at Riba, halal income, and different types of Halal financing when it comes to mortgage and businesses
11	The year 11 has completed the study of theme A, B, AND C. They will finish off theme F in January. They have sat a mock exam on paper 2. InshAllah they have studied hard, and we pray the results pay off.  In IS, we looked at the Fiqh of etiquettes of behaviour in society, in the Masjid, at home, and at school. InshAllah they can apply this new information from the Quran and Sunnah to their daily lives.

## **Computer Science**

Class	Topics covered so far
7	The year 7 has looked at an introductory of how computers work through a scientific point of view. Some students have gained a lot of knowledge into binary, denary, and how computer software work.
8	The year 8 students have studied an introductory lesson to writing algorithms using python. They looked what is required to chain information together e.g. if else statements and symbols to get functions to work.
9	The students have had an exciting term creating their own app. They have done this via appshed online. Students have really enjoyed this. This has provided them with an introduction of how app creation works.
10	Year 10 students have completed units 1 and 2 of the CS. We have used the common errors from this assessment to re-evaluate the difficult topics from unit 1. Students will sit an assessment on unit 3 in January InshAllah.
11	Students have completed units 1 to 3. They have sat a mock exam, and are focusing to continue gaining-more content from unit 3,4,5 and 6.













## **History**

Class	Topics covered so far
7	Year 7 have completed Unit 1 and moved on to Unit 2. They are currently learning about the Battle of Hastings and why the Normans decided to invade the Anglo-Saxons.
8	Year 8 have just completed 'The Golden Age', the reign of Queen Elizabeth I and how it affected England. Year 8's is able to explain whether or not they agree if the 'Golden Age' of England was truly the golden age. Looking at different perspectives such as wealth and poverty, the Spanish Armada will help the students formulate an answer.
9	Year 9 have completed the first and second unit of the first History GCSE book, Crime and Punishment. They have also completed half of the third unit which takes a look at the industrial revolution era. Years 9's are progressing really well and are on course to complete the book by March Insha'Allah.
10	Year 10 have completed the second out of the four History GCSE books, The reigns of King Richard and King John, 1189-1215. A whole book test was completed and students are eager to find out their results. They will be starting the third History book, USA: home and abroad.
11	Year 11 have completed the last of the four History GCSE books as well as finishing off their Mock exams. They will now start revision from the first book, Crime and Punishment.


#### **Year 7 Present Their Dream Jobs**


#### **Year 7 Get Stuck into Arabic**










### V&A Museum - Year 9

Once again, we have teamed up with charity organisation Ummah Welfare Trust this winter to raise funds for the poor and needy in Ethiopia.


Over the last few weeks, we have been collecting donations to provide water wells for the people of Ethiopia.
