




Annual Quran Competition




Introducing Reading Cloud!





Lailatul-Qadr (The Night of Power)



'Lailat ul-Qadr' or 'Night of Power' is a very important occasion in the history of Islam and in our personal lives.

Allah says in the Qur'an in Surah Al-Qadr:

"We have indeed revealed this (message) in the Night of Power. And what will explain to thee what the Night of Power is? The Night of Power is better than a thousand months. Therein come down the angels and the spirit by God's permission, on every errand: Peace! This until the rise of Morn."

(Quran 97:1-5)

The Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) said about Lailatul-Qadr:

It as narrated by Abu Hurayra that Prophet (pbuh) said, "Anyone who stays awake for the Night of Power with belief and for the pleasure of Allah, all his previous sins will be forgiven."

(Bukhari and Muslim)

As far as determining the Night of Power (Lailatul Qadr) is concerned, it has been reported to be during one of the odd numbered nights of the last ten days of Ramadan, i.e. 21st, 23rd, 25th, 27th or 29th.

Narrated by Aisha (RA): With the start of the last ten days of Ramadan, the Prophet () used to tighten his waist belt (i.e. work hard) and used to pray all the night, and used to keep his family awake for the prayers. (Sahih al-Bukhari)

The Messenger of Allah PBUH would observe I'tikaf in the last ten days of Ramadan" (Bukhari)

The observance of Itikaf in the last ten days and nights of Ramadan is an emphasised Sunnah of our Prophet PBUH. Itikaf helps to enhance one's spiritual growth and to strive hard to worship Allah better as there is nothing to distract one's attention from this noble pursuit.

We must make a firm intention that during these blessed 10 nights, we will not take part in idle talk, watch TV, play computer games or spend time on the social media. There are 355 days in the year for all that – if you really cannot resist. This is just 10 nights! There will be indeed an utter loss and regret for those of us who waste these blessed 10 nights.

May Allah grant us the ability to worship and serve him during these blessed last 10 days and nights of Ramadhan and truly attain his closeness and friendship.

O You Who is Everliving and sustains everything, I seek assistance through your mercy. 2nd Ashra (Second 10 days of Ramadan): Days of Forgiveness

أَسْتَغْفِرُ الله وَأَتُوْبُ إِلَيْه

seek Allah's forgiveness and I return to Him (Hibban, 928).

Duas for Ramadan

3rd Ashra (Last 10 days of Ramadan): Days to seek refuge from Hellfire

اَللُّهُمَّ اَجِرْنِيْ مِنَ النَّار

O Allah! I seek your protection from the hellfire (Abu Dawud).

Dua for Lailatul Qadr

اَللَّهُمَّ إِنَّكَ عَفُوٌّ تُحِبُّ الْعَفْوَ فَاعْفُ عَنِّى

O Allah! You are most forgiving, you love to forgive, so forgive me (Tirmidhi).

Asked Siddiqah bint Al-Siddiq [RA], "what if I knew which night Laylatul Qadr was, then what should I say in it?"

He [SAWS] said, "Say

Curriculum Update

History

This Half Term we have covered the following topics



<u>Year</u>	Subject Information		
7	Year 7s have completed all of unit 1 and half of unit 2. They have learnt about how the Norman Conquest changed England, the role of medieval monarchs and examples of successful and unsuccessful rulers, the causes and development of the First Crusade and the nature of links between the Christian and Muslim world.		
<u>8</u>	Year 8s have completed the whole of Unit 4. They have learnt the key developments in Elizabeth's reign including the defeat of the Spanish Armada, the Elizabethan Poor Law, the activities of British privateers and explorers and the cultural developments, the causes and development of the English Civil War, the key features of the Mughal Empire between the fifteenth and eighteenth centuries, as a significant society beyond Europe.		
<u>9</u>	Year 9s have completed the second unit of the first GCSE book: Crime and Punishment. The second chapter explains how Religion became more volatile and dangerous when Henry VIII became King and created his own Church of England. This led to a religious division between Catholics and Protestants and new crimes and punishments were created. We have also learnt about other events such as the Gun Powder Plot and Witch-craft and how it impacted society.		
<u>10</u>	Year 10s have started the third GCSE book USA: Home and Abroad. This book is about the struggles of Black people and how life was like in the early 1900s. We come across key events such as Little Rock Nine and Brown v Topeka case. We have also learnt about many key figures such as Martin Luther King, Emmett Till and Rosa Parks. These individuals played a key role in starting the protests against Racism and Segregation.		
<u>11</u>	Years 11s have completed all four GCSE books and are currently practicing exam style questions, ranging from 4-marks to 16-marks. We have gone over all 3 exam papers and learnt how to structure answers depending on the style of questions.
