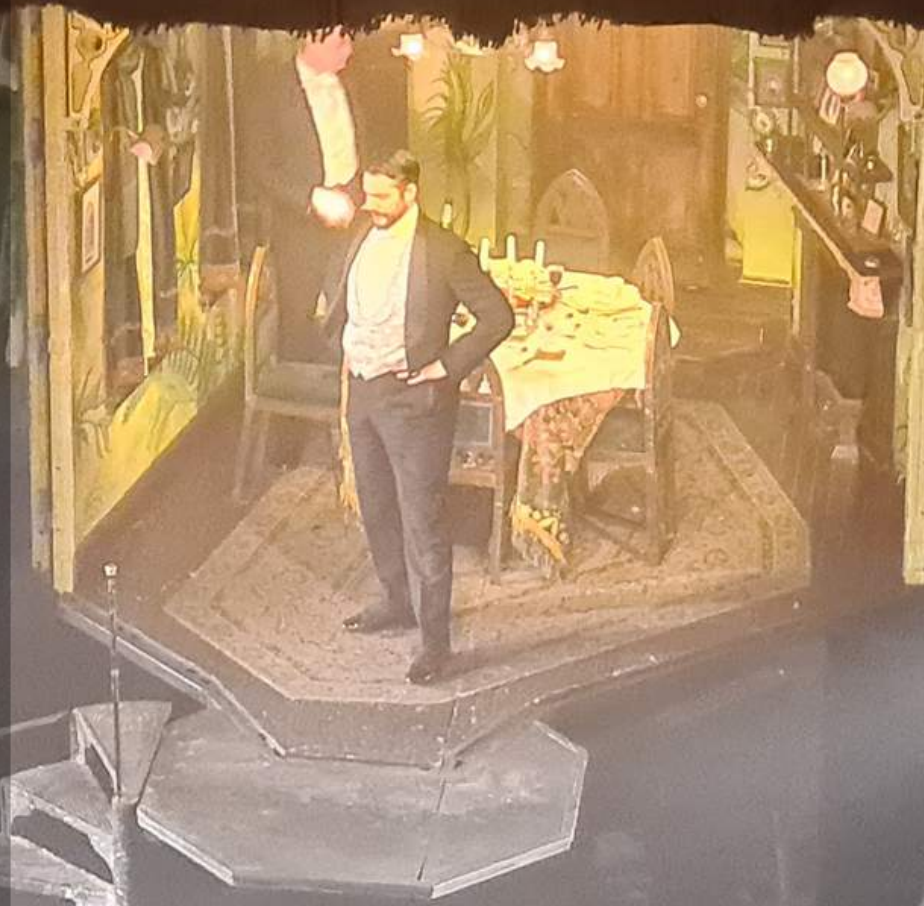

The Trip was part of the School sustainable travel initiative to promote pupils walking & cycling to school



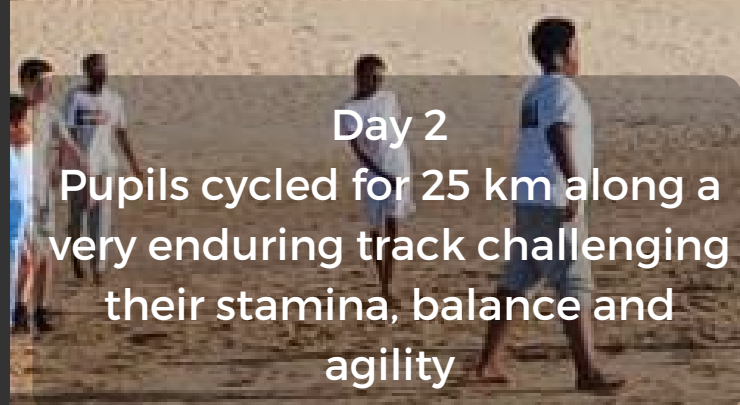
The first day was for trekking. Pupils went on a trek in the country experiencing some stunning landscapes and views
