Alhamdulillah, our School was very fortunate to have held its 7th Annual Qur'an Recitation Competition this year, on 21st March 2023 at our school.


Tawhid BOYS SCHOOL

#### Who are they?

Human Relief Foundation provides humanitarian aid for natural disasters, armed conflicts, and poverty globally. Our focus areas include emergency response, education, orphan care, healthcare, and sanitation. We have responded to major crises and are currently providing aid in response to floods and earthquakes. We also provide food and assistance to financially struggling individuals in the UK, including homeless people in Luton.

Where the donations will go how will it be used A 7.7 magnitude earthquake hit southern Turkey and northern Syria on 6 Feb 2023, with over 55,000 casualties and multiple aftershocks. The disaster worsened the already dire humanitarian situation, particularly in Syria, where conflict and displacement have persisted for 12 years. The earthquakes caused new displacement movements, affecting at least 86,000 people, with over half being children.



This Ramadan student across the school have been collecting money for Human Relief Foundation. JazakAllah to all the students efforts and families who have helped to donate.
















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
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Lailatul-Qadr (The Night of Power)





### Lailatul-Qadr (The Night of Power)

'Lailat ul-Qadr' or 'Night of Power'... a very important occasion in the history of Islam and in our personal lives.



Allah says in the Qur'an in Surah Al-Qadr: "We have indeed revealed this (message) in the Night of Power. And what will explain to thee what the Night of Power is? The Night of Power is better than a thousand months. Therein come down the angels and the spirit by God's permission, on every errand: Peace! This until the rise of Morn." (97:1-5)

Allah also says about this powerful night in Surah Dukhan (smoke, mist): Ha. Mim. By the book that makes things clear. We sent it down during a blessed night. For We (ever) wish to warn (against evil). In that (night) is made distinct every affair of wisdom, by command, from Our Presence. For We (ever) send (revelations), as a mercy from Thy Lord: for He hears and knows (all things). (44:1-6)

Allah said in the Qur'an in Surah Al-Baqarah (the Cow): "Ramadan is the (month) in which was sent down the Qur'an, as a guide to mankind, also clear (signs) for guidance and judgment (between right and wrong)."(2:185)

Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) said about Lailatul-Qadr: It as narrated by Abu Hurayra that Prophet said, "Anyone who stays awake for the Night of Power with belief and for the pleasure of Allah, all his previous sins will be forgiven." (Bukhari and Muslim)

As far as determining the Night of Power (Lailatul Qadr) is concerned, it has been reported

to be during one of the odd numbered nights of the last ten days of Ramadan, i.e. 21st, 23rd, 25th, 27th or 29th.

If you are interested in living the Night of Power, let me remind you of some of the things that you might have to do.

On the nights one may spend the time collectively and/or individually observing the following activities:

- Recitation of the Our'an.
- Prayers-Nafl after Taraweeh.
- Remembrance of Allah (Dhikr)
- Supplication (Du'as) for you and for others.



- Pondering and contemplating into the universe, the creation of the Heavens and the Earth: "...and they contemplate the (wonders of) creation in the heaven and the earth..." (3:191)
- Reading books of Hadeeth so as to enjoy the sayings of Prophet Muhammad (pbuh).
- Reading Tafseer of Qur'an.
- Giving charity to others if you can afford it.
- Trying to explain Islam, if you know something about it, to those next to you so they will benefit from you.




